

Ron Shaffer brought in a sphere turned out of Walnut and finished with his Beal Buff.



Matt Castro had a segmented sphere turned from Poplar and Cedar with a polyurethane finish.



Jeremy LeMosler had a sphere turned from Maple with a wax finish.



Susan Libicki had a sphere turned from hard Maple with no finish.



Kate Sutherland entered a nice sphere that was turned from Ash with a little bit of an oil finish.



Thomas Cassidy had a "sort of" round ball turned out of mystery wood, perhaps Cocobolo. It was finished with carnauba wax.



John Janssen brought in two spheres turned out of Maple. Both were finished with wax and Minwax Polycrylic.



Steve Cassidy brought in a sphere turned out of Silver Maple and finished with friction polish.



Henry Koch brought a small sphere turned out of mystery wood. It was finished with Butcher block oil.



Bill Loitz had a sphere turned out of wood that he described as "dark and hard". It was finished with wax.



Brian Williamson brought in a pair of spheres turned out of mystery wood with no finish.



Jim O'Connor brought in a two spheres turned out of Osage Orange and Poplar with no finish. The Osage Orange sphere was the winner!



Robin Brown brought in a pair of spheres. The first was turned from figured Maple and the other of Walnut. They were finished with Tung oil.



Pete Carta brought in a sphere turned out of Osage Orange and finished with wax. He chose to keep it under wraps before the contest. (It didn't help.)



SHOW AND TELL

We started off with **John Janssen** and his pair of candle sticks. They were turned out of Chinese Elm and finished with Minwax Polycrylic.



Henry Koch brought in two bowls. The first was turned out of pieces of Red and White Oak. The second was a sculpted piece turned out of Maple and Walnut. Both were finished with lacquer.



Lou Hansen brought in a segmented vessel turned out of Maple and Purpleheart. It was finished with lacquer.



Steve Cassidy brought in a turned and carved mojito muddler. The handle was turned out of Maple and the end was Brazilian Rosewood. It was finished with 5 coats of walnut oil. The photo shows the metal original used to model the Maple one.



Steve also brought in a Maple sample board that he did with his new Versa tool wood burner.



James Hurst brought in three bowls turned from a stemstrand construction beam. They all had a CA finish.



Ron Shaffer brought in two platters. The first was turned out of Black Walnut with a turquoise Inlace ring. The second was turned out of Maple with a wood burned rim with copper guilders paste. Both were finished with Danish oil.



We finished up with **Bob Wohlers**. He brought back the Mesquite candle stick that he had begun in his demo at the August meeting. And he also brought an Olive salt cellar turned and carved into a witch's hat.
