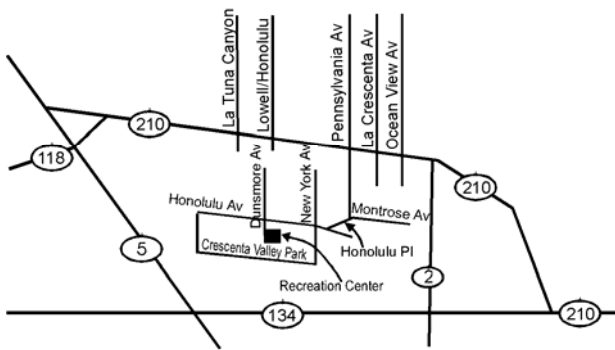

And the winner in the category was **Joel Jaffe** with his Cut Leaf Maple cowboy hat with a polymer oil finish.



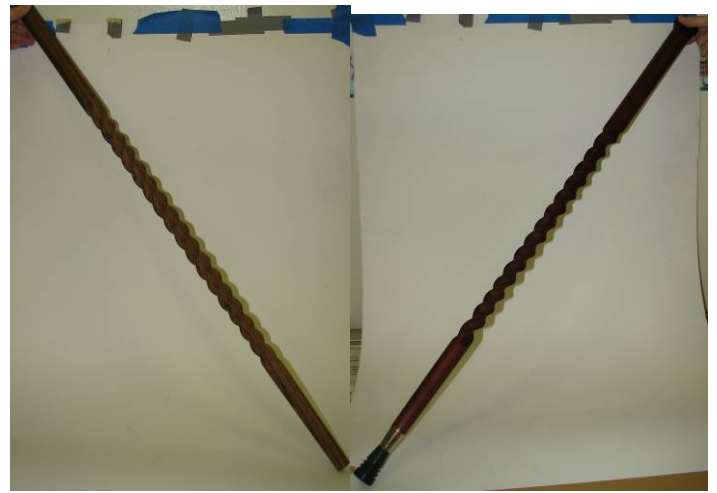
In the Advanced category there were also only three entries. **Amy Earhart** brought in a Curly Maple scratch awl that is being used as an ice pick in the kitchen.

The winner in the category was **Pete Carta** with his Maple and Cocobolo finial box. It was finished with lacquer and wax.



Carl Christensen brought in a bowl turned from Aspen with an oil and poly finish.

Terrell Hasker brought in a set of nested Black Acacia bowls that he roughed out using his McNaughton system.



He also brought in two walking sticks described as "triple start diminishing ribbon twist". The first is from Bolivian Rosewood and the second is from Padouk, Ebony and brass. Simply wonderful.



Jim Givens brought in a Manzanita Burl and Ebony piece entitled "Orb on a Stand". It had a CA and lacquer finish.

Jim O'Connor brought in two bowls. The first was full of eggs turned from many different types of wood. The second was of Oak with a walnut oil finish.



Bob Coleberd brought in a turned compote of Elm and Mahogany. It was finished with shellac.



Kathy Hein brought in three bowls. The first is Italian Cypress; the second is Camphor and the third is Ficus. All were finished with a product called Good Stuff.



Bill Haskell brought in a Red Gum Eucalyptus Burl hollow form with a small neck and carved design. It had a CA and lacquer finish.



Sandy Huse brought in her efforts from the **Alan Batty** class that she attended along with several other of our members.

Deb Sigel brought in a beautiful Challah tray that she was commissioned to make. It is Maple with an acrylic paint design.



And **Lew Soloway** brought in a stunning group of fountain pens that he has turned; a combination of woods and acrylics.
