

CHALLENGE

The challenge this month was a Scepter or Crown. The judges this month were **Carey Caires, Stephen Powell** and **Jack Wooddell**.

We had a slim turnout for this challenge. The only entries were in the Advanced category. The winner was **Dick Lukes** with his unusual shaped scepter made from cocobolo and finished with French polish. It has a very thin parting tool inside.



Also in the advanced category was a magic scepter by **Bill Pounds** made of walnut and maple and finished with Hut wax. (I think Harry Potter is looking for this.)



And also in the category was **Bill Noble**, who said it is "either a scepter or a medical device used on a gerbil." Nice job Bill, it fit right in with Carey's presentation on miniatures.



Show and Tell

Jim O'Connor brought in five more spherical boxes turned from Cocobolo, Bubinga, Bocote, Osage Orange and Black Locus on ebony stands.



Ed Hotchkin brought in a hollow form turned from Masur Birch with a carved finial.



Cal Elshoff brought in an oriental dish turned from walnut and mystery wood, its dimensions are 10" x 14" x 2".



Ed also brought in a large hollow form of Manzanita.



And finally, **Al Falck** brought in three different pieces. The first was an urn made up from carob and ebony.



Dan Hogan brought in a terrific large open vessel turned from Buckeye Burl and finished with CA and Lacquer.



The second was a weed pot of Poplar and Carob.



The third was a covered bowl made from walnut and alder.



PRESENTATION

Our Queen **Carey Caires** gave us a presentation on turning miniatures. Her handout was a very thorough two pages, the hand out is posted on our website.

She brought some examples of her pieces for us to see up close and marvel at and she also had slides to illustrate her presentation. She prefers to turn at 2600 RPM instead of the 1240 in her old notes. And regarding her sanding notes, she now starts at 220 grit and goes up to 8000 grit sometimes. She prefers "Micro Mesh" which has a grit range from 1500 to 12,000 and is available from Rockler and some other woodworking stores. One of the advantages to turning miniatures is that you don't have to sharpen your tools as often and you can probably hone them in between sharpening.

It was a good presentation and I am looking forward to the demo on July 28th!
