



Sunday Demo

On Sunday November 9th we had **Craig Sobel** demonstrate how to do the spiral segmented vessels. He passed out a two page explanation of the project that was inspired by the turnings of **Hal Metlitsky**. The finished bowl is 12" in diameter and 6 1/4" high. Here it is on the chuck.



There were 27 rings, each about 3/16" thick. Each ring is twisted at about 15 degrees. There are about 75 pieces per ring so there are over 2000 pieces in this bowl. Here is a photo of the next ring that was to go on the bowl.



Here is the bowl looking down into the center. I hope that **Craig** will bring this back when it is completed so we can appreciate the finished project.



If you are interested in segmented turning **Craig** recommends the book by **Malcolm Tibbett's** "The Art of Segmented Turning".
