The May challenge was “**Blowups**” that were **saved**.

There were few entries, so they were combined, with **Henry Koch** as the winner with his maple and walnut bowl finished with lacquer.



Larry Margules had a candle holder made from manzanita found on a road in Lake Arrowhead. (*I believe the two other unturned pieces were brought in by him, also.*)



Judges were **Bob Wohlers, Bill Loitz, and Carey Caires**.

SHOW AND TELL

Ricardo Gutierrez brought in and described a jig for sharpening lathe tools. Similar to commercially available systems, he found the instructions for making this on the internet.



Henry Koch showed a hollow vessel of sycamore, finished with Watco Danish Oil, while **Kathy Hein** had a birch vase, friction polished.



Ron Shaffer had an open segment bowl with feature ring. Woods were padauk, maple, cherry & walnut, finished with Arm-R-Seal. **Jim Schopper** brought a platter of eggs (as well as the chuck for them) made from various wood including walnut, olive, figured maple & honey locust, finished with Mahoney's Walnut Oil.



Scott Johnston had a pierced lidded vessel of avocado finished with black glaze and satin lacquer. (This may have been a challenge entry, my notes don't say)
