CHALLENGE

The February challenge was Carved Turnings.

The winner in the Beginner category was **Chris Dodson** with a carved bowl of fir, outside finished with the Japanese Shou Sugi Ban technique (burning) and walnut oil; the inside had India ink.



There was only one entry in the Intermediate category, so it was bumped to Advanced. The winner here was **Bob Wohler** with a fluted bowl of olive & silver maple finished with urethane.



Other entries: **Carey Caires** had a carob hair pin finished with Mahoney walnut oil & wax, while **Bob Freeman** had a carved fir platter finished with Wood Turners finish.



Dan Gustavson had a carved, woodburned & painted vase of pear, acrylic, and epoxy finished with spar varnish (two views)



Gary Willoughby also had a bowl, this one of Koa finished with Mahoney oil, while **Bill Loitz** had a maple baby rattle, wax finish.



Klaus Schmitt had been busy - his "tower of Pisa" was of sycamore, and his ceremonial bowl was from red cedar with stone & acorns. Both pieces were finished with lacquer spray and sanding sealer.



Judges were **Jim Schopper**, **Anton Bosch**, and **Carl Haney**.

SHOW AND TELL

We start with a pair of bowls, by **Jim Schopper**. the first of acacia, the second of "unknown", both finished with walnut oil.



He also had a couple of hollow forms, Yucca wood with cocobolo neck; walnut & maple with cocobolo and red jasper stone neck. Again, sanding sealer & spray lacquer were the finishes.



Sandy Huse showed her “spin off” of hard maple, cherry, copper & paint.

PRESENTATION

Our February presentation was by past president **Bill Loitz**, on preparing blanks from logs (mainly chain saw work).



His carefully prepared *Power Point* presentation was still residing on his hard drive at home, so he winged it with the markers and whiteboard we had.

In preparing logs, you generally want to remove the pith, since this will almost always start cracking. He discussed various strategies for laying out blanks for bowls & platters from different types of logs in order to get nice grain patterns. He also described the type of frame he uses to stabilize logs for cutting, and how to line up cuts efficiently by making “nick” cuts and rotating the log so it can be cut safely. Wooden circles act as guides to saw the blanks closer to an initial round shape. Pieces can be rough turned to uniform thickness, which will help them dry with minimal cracking.

Instead of using the usual Anchor Seal, he has been trying the green wood sealer from Craft Supplies USA recently. Certain woods also benefit from being boiled to assist the drying process.

He also talked about handling crotch pieces, where there are actually 3 piths to deal with.
