Possible Upcoming Challenges:

Amy Earhart proposed some challenges, and is willing to bring examples of each to the preceding month's meeting:

Here are my suggestions for future challenges, with some possibilities:

July-*Patriotic Turning (Red, white and blue or Flag like)*

August- *Square Turning (bowl, platter, handle, vase)*

September- *Flower Turning (inset in turning or pattern or flower like)*

October- *Tool Turning- (handles, measuring devices)*

November- *Ornamental Turning- (actual holiday ornaments or any ornamented turning)*

CHALLENGE

The **May Challenge** was to have been "**Most Perfect Sphere 2 to 5 inch Diameter**". There were not enough entrants to the challenge, so it was decided "no challenge".

Sandy Huse had another of her oddball creations, an "Eye-Ball" made from a Spam can, wooden ball, googly eyes & beads.



Dale Gertsch had balls of camphor and magnolia, lacquer & wax finish.



Show & Tell

Not a big crowd at the May meeting, but had a number of objects from various people:

Carey Caires had a baseball and baseball bat of maple, Mylands & felt pen. As is common with Carey's pieces, I had to use a high powered microscope to photograph her piece.



Dale Gertsch gave us a couple of humming bird houses, zebra and camphor, lacquer & wax finish.



James Hurst had a two vases and a bowl: Douglas fir, paint & shellac (along with a story of failing finishes); cyprus, & Apoxie eucalyptus. Latter two finished with Mylands.



Reaching double digits, **Bill Haskell** had #10 in his parabolic spin pieces - black acacia, oil & lacquer.



Scott Johnston had bottle stoppers, a carved one of walnut, another of figured makore & birch ball, both finished with lacquer. A pedestal dish of walnut & soft maple, burnt umber & lacquer.



Amy Earhart has been taking a turning class, so she has been forced to actually turn some objects: a mahogany plate with Mahoney oil, and a Podocarpus bowl with shellac, milk paint & lacquer.



Jim Schopper had a "drought" bowl of macadamia nut, black paint & lacquer.



Carl Haney filled out a slip with description: 2 pieces of green wood, blond is carob, pink is Brazilian pepper, 2 pieces of IDK (I don't know?) wood. Sam Maloof finish. *I hope the pieces I photographed actually have some connection to that slip.*



Presentation

Accompanied by his "mobile microphone stand" (our President, **Thomas Cassidy**), **Bill Haskell** gave a presentation on "**Sanding and More**"

Bill distributed a several page handout, and talked about how to get good surfaces on your pieces, both with proper tool use and use of abrasives.

He showed how to make various sanding jigs and attachments, walked us through his preferred sanding & finishing techniques, and his preferences in sandpapers.

We need ideas/wants for future presentations. Some suggestions have been basic spindle and/or bowl turning for newer members, workholding techniques (specialty/homemade chucks, etc.), Sharpening techniques for chainsaws, lathe tools (might need longer time frame for that).

We do not know at this time whether we will be able to hold actual turning demos at this new site, stay tuned...

If Internet/WiFi is sufficient at this site, we could hold on-line demos, unknown possibility at present.
