PRESENTATION



Our presentation this month was given by **Craig Sobel** on the basics of pen turning. He did not actually turn a pen, but gave information on what tools & parts were needed, along with sources, and described the process of preparing, turning and finishing the final product. He distributed a handout with the steps involved, and also prices from various retailers. Items other than pens can also be turned, using the same mandrel system.
